OVEMBER TIMELY TIPS










Apply a pre-emergent weed control to open areas in your landscape. Many cool-season weeds, including cheatgrass will emerge in late winter or very early spring. Apply by the end of the month to get ahead of next year's weeds.



Once nighttime temps drop to below freezing For a Yew consecutive days, turn off your irrigation system & drain the values.



THAT'S A WRAP

Wrap evergreen trees & shrubs like arborvitaes with plastic or twine to prevent splaying of branches during winter snowstorms.



Cover any Prep all cold sensitive pottery for empty pots, winter weather. Drain any standing or, if possible, water, remove drip trays, lift pots move indoors off the ground using pot feet or or store in a wood blocks. Ground water can pool shed or garage. 🚫 and freeze to the pot, which leads to cracking & breaking.



STORE ALL UNUSED FERTILIZERS, HERBICIDES, PESTICIDES AND CHEMICALS IN ORIGINAL, LABELED CONTAINERS: CHECK EXPIRATION DATES TO BE SURE THEY'RE STILL VIABLE. BE SURE TO STORE IN A WARM & DRY PLACE TO PREVENT FREEZING.

Continue to plant and water newly planted trees and shrubs, especially evergreens, until the ground freezes.





AFTER THE GROUND FREEZES.

MULCH GARDEN BEDS

Avoid walking on frozen lawns; frozen grass blades are very fragile and will break under pressure.



Regularly rake lawns to keep falling leaves and twigs from suffocating grass.
